

When using your vacuum cleaner, basic precautions should always be followed, including the following:

Read all instructions in this manual before assembling or using your vacuum cleaner.

WARNING To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, injury:

- Read all instructions in this manual before assembling or using your vacuum cleaner.
- Use your cleaner only as described in this manual. Use only with Panasonic recommended attachments.
- Disconnect electrical supply before servicing or cleaning out the brush area. Failure to do so could result in electrical shock or the brush suddenly starting.
- Do not leave cleaner when plugged in. Unplug from outlet when not in use and before servicing.
- To reduce the risk of electrical shock Do not use outdoors or on wet surfaces.
- Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.
- Do not use with a damaged cord or plug. If cleaner is not working as it should, has been dropped, damaged, left outdoors, or dropped in water, return it to a Panasonic Service
- 8. Do not pull or carry by cord, use cord as a handle, close a door on cord, or pull cord around sharp edges or corners. Do not run cleaner over cord. Keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- 9. **Do not** unplug by pulling on cord. To unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord.
- 10. Do not handle plug or cleaner with wet hands.

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS



This vacuum cleaner must be grounded. If it should malfunction or breakdown, grounding provides a path of least resistance for electric current to reduce the risk of electric shock. This vacuum cleaner is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor and grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an appropriate outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances.

A DANGER


Improper connection of the equipment-grounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock. Check with a qualified electrician or service person if you are in doubt as to whether the outlet is properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided with the vacuum cleaner – if it will not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

This vacuum cleaner is for use on a nominal 120-volt circuit, and has a grounding plug that looks like the plug illustrated in **Figure A**. Make sure that this vacuum cleaner is connected to an outlet having the same configuration as the plug.

No adapter should be used with this vacuum cleaner.

Note: Before you plug in your commercial vacuum cleaner, make sure that the voltage indicated on the rating plate located at the back of the vacuum cleaner is the same as your local supply.




ASSEMBLY

Attaching Handle




1)

- DO NOT plug in until assembly is complete.
- > Remove handle screw.
- ➤ Insert handle.




2)

- ➤ Insert screw.
- ➤ Tighten screw.



3)


> Push power cord into cord clip.



4)

- Wrap power cord around cord hook.
- Secure retainer (plug head) to power cord.


Tool Storage



- Some tools may already be stored on vacuum cleaner.
- Place hose in front of handle on hose holder.
- Attach wand to hose by aligning the two (2) raised tabs on wand with "J" slots in hose, guide tabs along grooves, twist to lock in place.
- Place wand in middle slot of tool holder, twisting and pushing down over short hose to assure a good connection.
- Store dusting brush in round front slot of tool holder.
- Place crevice tool into rectangular rear slot of tool holder.
- Refer to PARTS IDENTIFICATION section for tool location.



Edge Cleaning



Edge cleaning feature enables improved cleaning of carpets near walls and furniture.

Motor Protector




- Automatically opens to provide cooling air to the motor when a clog occurs or when dust bag needs changing.
- Motor protector may open when using tools.
- If motor protector opens, the vacuum cleaner will make a slightly different sound.

Note: Do not block motor protector.


TO OPERATE VACUUM CLEANER

ON-OFF Switch




- > Ensure ON-OFF switch is OFF.
- > Plug the power cord into 120V outlet.
- > ON position turns vacuum cleaner on.
- OFF position turns vacuum cleaner off.

Handle Adjustments



- Step on handle release pedal to change handle position.
- ➤ Move vacuum cleaner to upright position for storage and tool use.
- ➤ Move vacuum cleaner to middle position for normal use.
- Use low position for cleaning under furniture.

Using Tools






If tools are used, and vacuum cleaner is left in upright position, carpet damage could occur.

Agitator rotates when using tools, use care to ensure that nothing comes into contact with agitator.

- Remove wand from short hose by twisting and pulling up.
- ➤ The tools can be attached to hose, wand or crevice tool.
- DO NOT overextend your reach with hose as it could tip vacuum cleaner.
- Place all tools and hose back in the same manner as shown in TOOL STORAGE.



ROUTINE CARE OF VACUUM CLEANER

Performing the following tasks will keep your new Panasonic vacuum cleaner operating at peak performance levels and will ensure these high levels for years to come. Check the BEFORE REQUESTING SERVICE section in this manual for recommendations on performing some of these tasks to help solve various problems that may occur.

Replacing Secondary HEPA Filter




- Secondary HEPA filter protects the motor.
- Check filter when installing a new dust bag.
- If dirty, pull filter from bottom of dust compartment and replace.
- Place new filter, white side up, in dust compartment, DO NOT CLEAN WITH WATER*.
- Ensure filter is fully inserted under plastic ribs.

*Filter cannot be cleaned and should be replaced at least once each year.


Changing Dust Bag

Always operate vacuum cleaner with genuine Panasonic Type U3 Standard or U6 Electrostatic dust bags installed. Panasonic dust bags may be purchased through any authorized Panasonic dealer or ordered from service company.





> Pull outward on dust cover grip to remove the dust cover.

Remove dust bag by grasping cardboard portion and pulling out.

Spread out new dust bag, taking care not to tear bag.

Attach new dust bag onto bag holder by holding cardboard portion and pushing back.

Reinsert tab on end of dust cover into groove on dust compartment to allow cover to rotate closed.






Rotate dust cover up into closed position and press into place without pinching dust bag.



Disconnect the electrical supply before servicing or cleaning the unit. Failure to do so could result in electrical shock or personal injury from cleaner suddenly starting.

Removing and Installing Lower Plate









- Before servicing any parts, disconnect vacuum cleaner from electrical outlet.
- > Place paper under nozzle whenever lower plate is removed to protect floor.
- Place handle in upright position and turn vacuum cleaner over to expose lower plate.
- > Release lower plate by pressing two (2) latches inward.
- Remove lower plate and remove any residue that may exist in belt area.
- > Lift belt cover to replace belt if necessary. (See Replacing Belt page
- Close the rear belt cover and reinstall lower plate by hooking front end of lower plate into the front of nozzle housing.
- Make sure all wires are routed properly and not pinched.
- > Press lower plate into place then push two (2) latches outward.

Replacing Belt









- Replace belt whenever a burning rubber smell caused by excessive slippage occurs.
- > Remove lower plate.
- Lift rear belt cover and remove agitator holder.
- Remove agitator by carefully lifting out.
- > Remove worn or broken belt.
- > Clean agitator.
- Loop new belt (Panasonic Type UB8 only) around motor shaft and agitator pulley.
- Reinstall agitator back into nozzle housing grooves.
- Close rear belt cover and reinstall agitator.
- After reinstalling the agitator, turn it by hand to make sure that belt is not twisted or pinched and that all rotating parts turn freely.
- ➤ Reinstall lower plate. (See Removing and Installing Lower Plate, page 28).

Cleaning Agitator





- Clean agitator after every five uses and every time the belt is replaced.
- > Remove lower plate.
- Cut off any carpet pile and lint entangled around agitator with a pair of scissors.
- > Remove agitator.
- Remove any string or debris located on the end caps, washers or agitator shaft
- > Reinstall agitator and lower plate.


Replacing Brushes












- When the bristles on the agitator are worn so that they do not touch a card held across the lower plate, the brushes should be replaced.
- Remove lower plate and agitator.
- Remove the E-clip from agitator shaft and end cap.
- Do not bend agitator shaft or lose Eclip or spacer.
- Pull agitator shaft out of agitator body.
- Pull, or pry out, agitator holder and agitator pulley.
- Push each brush out of agitator body as shown.
- Install new brushes by reversing procedure.
- Reinstall agitator holder and agitator pulley completely.
- Reinstall the agitator shaft, end cap and E-clip.
- See exploded view for correct assembly of parts.
- Position belt over agitator pulley on the agitator.
- > Reinstall agitator and lower plate.


Agitator Assembly



Cleaning Exterior and Tools

- > Unplug cord from wall outlet.
- Clean exterior using a clean, soft cloth that has been dipped in a solution of mild liquid detergent and water and wrung dry.
- > DO NOT drip water on vacuum cleaner; wipe dry after cleaning.
- > DO NOT clean tools in dishwasher or clothes washer.
- > Wash tools in warm soapy water, rinse and air dry.
- ightharpoonup DO NOT use tools if they are wet.

Removing Clogs



The hose located on the back of the vacuum cleaner carries the dirt from the nozzle up to the dust bag. If the hose should become clogged:

- ➤ Unplug vacuum.
- Pull open suction inlet cover and check for clogging.
- Disconnect wand from short hose and check wand and hose.
- > Plug in vacuum cleaner and turn on.
- Disconnect wand and stretch hose in and out to remove clog.
- If clog still exists, turn vacuum cleaner OFF and <u>UNPLUG POWER</u> CORD.
- > Remove lower plate.
- Remove short hose from nozzle by lifting straight up.
- Inspect hose end and clear any obstructions.
- > Reinstall short hose and lower plate.

This Limited Warranty Excludes both Labor and Parts for the following items: disposable dust bags, filters, belts, light bulbs, agitator brushes and batteries (if supplied).

This warranty is extended only to the original purchaser. A purchase receipt or other proof of date of original purchase will be required before warranty performance is rendered.

This warranty only covers failures due to defects in materials and workmanship which occur during normal use and does not cover damages which occur in shipment, or failures which are caused by products not supplied by the warrantor, or failures which result from accident, misuse, abuse, neglect, mishandling, misapplication, faulty installation, improper operation or maintenance, alteration, modification, power line surge, improper voltage supply, lightning damage, or service by anyone other than a Panasonic Authorized Servicenter, or damage that is attributable to acts of God.
